

Director's Notes

For almost a quarter-century, LTA audiences have enjoyed the telling and retelling of *A Christmas Carol*. This year's production tells the story from the perspective and imagination of a modern-day preteen who is a budding artist and bubbling with creativity. As her grandfather reads her the traditional story, she draws the scenes and brings them to life onstage. The interaction between generations emphasizes the themes of family and how traditions are altered through time. The concept has taken inspiration from the modern-day classic *The Princess Bride* in the form of passing down stories from generation to generation and the aesthetic of director Tim Burton in the design elements of the production. I hope you leave LTA thinking about your cherished holiday traditions and how those traditions are embraced anew by each generation.

In the arts, we must embrace new perspectives while remembering the traditions that led us to this point. This is how we, as a community of artists, thrive and grow. The stylized concept of this production is intended to inspire both young artists to embrace their creativity and experienced artists to support new concepts and approaches to their own art forms.

I hope you all enjoy my unique take on this classic Dickens story. I dedicate it to my families (both chosen and given), this community and all young artists who desire to share their perspective with the world!
